Growing Healthy Sunderland (GHS) offer schools an assembly at the start of the school year, to promote the service and how to access the school nursing service. This can be repeated if there is an emerging need within a school population and at transition points. GHS offer a weekly drop-in session at each secondary school in Sunderland, where the practitioners provide health promotion in relation to Health and Wellbeing and include information regarding health-related behaviours including smoking, drugs and alcohol.
